The Minister for Education and Skills (Huw Lewis): The Welsh Baccalaureate Qualification is highly regarded across stakeholder groups, as the independent Review of Qualifications revealed.

The response to WAQ64908 set out how litter-picking activity can be a small, but valuable, part of a much wider spectrum of learning and experiences which help learners to understand wider environmental issues. These issues are important to employers, the education sector and to wider society.

The aim of the Welsh Baccalaureate Core is to expose learners to activities that they would not otherwise have had and to develop skills that both employers and Universities consistently say that they want to see. Learning about environmental issues, potentially including some litter-picking, and activities such as planning, collating and delivering Christmas boxes can help develop and provide evidence of skills such as team-working, problem solving and communication. The Duke of Edinburgh Award also provides numerous opportunities to develop and provide evidence of these skills, for that very reason Duke of Edinburgh Award activities can play an important role in learners' Welsh Baccalaureate experiences.

In addition to the evidence from the Review of Qualifications that stakeholders value the Welsh Baccalaureate, UCAS has, on 2 occasions, reviewed the

Core of the Advanced level qualification. On both occasions their expert panel confirmed that the Core is valued at 120 UCAS tariff points – the same as an A grade A level. We also know that 77% of university courses accept the Welsh Baccalaureate as an entry qualification and we have excellent feedback from centres about offers that their learners have received and which include the Welsh Baccalaureate. For example learners from Radyr Comprehensive in Cardiff recently received over 250 offers from universities that value the Welsh Baccalaureate as an A grade. A significant proportion of those offers have come from Russell Group Universities such as Nottingham, Bristol, Exeter, Liverpool and Manchester.

The Director of Sixth Form at Radyr, commented that the Welsh Baccalaureate "continues to provide our students with some fantastic opportunities and is clearly giving them that all important advantage when applying for university places."

There are a small number of very well advanced schemes that have been identified by local health boards, namely, Brynmawr, Colwyn Bay and Dinas Powys, which will be subject to transitional arrangements. Other schemes are in the early stages of planning and development and will need, therefore, to be taken forward under the new policy framework.
