The Assembly welcomes Parkinson's Awareness Week, April 11th-17th 2005, with the theme 'Parkinson's Disease Society 'For any Age at any Stage'; recognises the Society's continuing efforts to improve quality of life for all people living with Parkinson's disease; welcomes the launch of the National Service Framework for Long Term Conditions in England but notes the inequity of services for people with Parkinson's disease across Wales; endorses the Society's continuing campaign for increased numbers of Parkinson's Disease Nurses to support some of the most vulnerable communities in Wales and congratulates the Society for investing over £30 million into research towards a cure.
