Lesley Griffiths: The importance of supporting healthcare services by improving health and tackling health inequalities is highlighted in Together for Health. We are committed to achieving this through Our Healthy Future and the Fairer Health Outcomes for All action plan and through Local Public Health Strategic Frameworks at the Health Board level from 2011-12 onwards. Guidance for the development of the frameworks, issued in 2011, requires Health Boards to identify health inequalities within the Health Board area, identify priority outcomes and set out the specific actions which will be taken to achieve them.

To inform the planning and delivery of high quality health services, Health Boards can utilise a range of needs assessments and professional support and publications including public health and primary care annual reports. National standards, policies and guidelines, such as those produced by the National Institute of Health and Clinical Excellence will underpin delivery.

Lesley Griffiths: The Index was developed as a tool to identify and understand deprivation in Wales, so that funding, policy, and programmes can be effectively focussed on the most disadvantaged communities.

The latest Welsh Index of Multiple Deprivation (WIMD) 2011, released on 31 August 2011, provides data on a number of key determinants on health and factors impacting health as well as identifying potential hotspots resulting from deprivation, rurality and access barriers due to population concentration. These are extremely useful in informing our service planning.

The WIMD is one of a number of tools available to us which we use when planning service provision with our partners in NHS Wales. Local Health Boards are required to identify and tackle inequalities in health outcomes within the populations they serve. In doing so, Local Health Boards utilise a range of evidence and statistics, including WIMD.
