THE ANIMAL BY-PRODUCTS (WALES) REGULATIONS 2006

Background

- 1. Regulation (EC) No. 1774/2002 concerning animal by-products has applied in Member States since 1 May 2003. The aim is to protect public and animal health and maintain consumer confidence in the livestock industry, by ensuring that animal by-products are used, processed or disposed of safely. Enforcing Regulations were introduced in all Member States as a result of this EU Regulation. This was introduced in Wales by The Animal By-Products (Wales) Regulations 2003, which came into force on 31 October 2003.
- 2. The EU Regulation provides for the European Commission to propose suitable transitional measures and amendments to the existing annexes to the Regulation.
- 3. Information on many of the proposals was circulated widely on 9 June 2003 and made available on the Assembly website; www.countryside.wales.gov.uk Discussions with interests have also taken place throughout negotiations on the EU measures.
- 4. The purpose of the EU Regulation is to protect animal and public health. It is based on a number of opinions of the EU Scientific Steering Committee, which addressed the risk to animal and public health from certain uses or disposal methods for animal by-products. These were primarily concerned with the risks from BSE, but also took account of the risks from other pathogens that may potentially be introduced or spread by animal by-products. These include exotic animal pathogens such as foot and mouth disease and classical swine fever (which are not present in Wales but may enter in illegally imported meat) and endemic animal and human pathogens (which are present in Wales) such as Salmonella, E. Coli and botulism.
- 5. The EU Regulation divides animal by-products into three risk categories and specifies the permitted treatment or disposal routes for each category of material and the standards of operation of the permitted outlets. The Regulation also provides for the European Commission to exercise its own competence to amend the Annexes to the Regulation and to introduce transitional measures. If the Commission wishes to do so, it must first consult the relevant scientific body where necessary, and then secure the agreement of a qualified majority of member States to its proposal.

Purpose and Intended effect of the measure

- 6. The intended effect of these Regulations, which apply in relation to Wales, is to revoke and re-make the Animal By-Products Regulations 2003, which made provision in Wales for the administration and enforcement of Regulation (EC) No. 1774/2002 of the European Parliament and of the Council laying down health rules concerning animal by-products not intended for human consumption, (OJ No. L273, 10.10.2002, p1). The EC Regulation will be administered by the State Veterinary Service (SVS) who will carry out site visits and inspections of Animal By-Product proposed sites The Assembly issues approvals or rejections based on recommendations by the SVS.
- 7. In addition, these Regulations repeal those provisions of the Slaughterhouses Act 1974 relating to knackers' yards (premises licensed by the local authorities for receiving dead stock and producing flesh from this for feeding dogs) in so far as they apply in Wales, as knackers' yards are now regulated under these Regulations. They repeal section 6 of the Dogs Act 1906 in so far as it applies in Wales, which related to leaving carcases in such a way that dogs could gain access to them, and replace it with a provision in regulation 11 prohibiting farmed livestock from access to unprocessed animal by-products. They also revoke the Rendering (Fluid Treatment) (Wales) Order 2001 and replace it with Schedule 2 to these Regulations.
- 8. These Regulations clarify and relax the position on the feeding to farmed animals catering waste or feed materials containing or derived from catering waste, which would allow farmers to feed catering waste to their livestock.
- 9. They also permit intra-species recycling for the feeding of fish with processed animal protein derived from the bodies or parts of bodies of fish (other than farmed fish of the same species).
- 10. It is an offence to take any animal by-product to premises where livestock is kept, however, these Regulations allow for the return of hides/skins to the place of origin, provided that there is an assurance by the person in control of the by-products that livestock do not have access to the by-product.
- 11. These Regulations lift previous restrictions on land as they define the use of pasture land that is intended to be used for grazing or cropping for feedingstuffs following the application or deposit of organic fertilisers and soil improvers. This provides greater freedom for landowners.
- 12. The Regulations defines the areas in Wales namely Bardsey and Caldey Islands, that are considered to be remote. In effect, this would allow livestock owners to bury carcasses in these areas. It also sets out the procedure for disposal of animal by products in the event of a disease outbreak situation.
- 13. The Regulation sets out transitional conditions that should be met to allow gelatine to be authorised for the manufacture of photographic products and the collection, transportation, processing, use & storage of milk, milk based products and milk derived products. Amongst other things this allows farmers to feed surplus milk to their livestock under certain conditions. Transitional

- measures on the collection, transportation and disposal of former foodstuffs shall cease to have effect on 1 January 2006.
- 14. Operators who do not comply may face prosecution. Prosecutions may result in a fine of up to £5000 and three months' imprisonment for cases heard in a magistrate's court or an unlimited fine and up to two years imprisonment for cases heard in the Crown Court. In addition, in the event of non-compliance, the Regulations provide for the suspension of an operator's approval, thus preventing the premises from receiving animal by-products.
- 15. In Wales enforcement of these Regulations is carried out by the Meat Hygiene Service in Slaughterhouses and by Local Authorities elsewhere. These bodies already undertake this role.

Risk Assessment

16. If this legislation were not introduced in Wales the implication for Welsh farmers would be that they could not, for instance, feed their livestock with surplus foodstuffs thus increasing their costs and putting them at a disadvantage to farmers in other Member States.

Options

17. In respect of this legislation the "Do Nothing" option is not an option as it would lead ultimately to infraction proceedings against the national Assembly for Wales by the European Commission. Therefore, the "Make the Legislation" option, to implement the changes required to comply with European legislation, is being recommended.

Make the Legislation

18. The purpose of this Regulation is to bring into effect clarification and deregulation negotiated with the EU the effect of the changes is primarily deregulatory and remove some requirements, which are now considered to be unnecessary.

Benefits

- 19. The Implementation of the Regulations will benefit farmers as they will be allowed to feed catering waste and surplus livestock (under certain conditions) to their livestock. In addition, they will also be permitted to bury carcasses in areas considered as remote (i.e. Bardsey and Caldey Islands).
- 20. Producers of hides and skins will be permitted to return them to place of origin, thus removing the need for the involvement of third parties, who currently carry out the role of processing hides and skins.

Costs

- 21. There are no financial implications for the Assembly as a result of the making of the proposed Regulations they are primarily deregulatory.
- 22. There would be costs savings to farmers as they would be able to feed catering waste and surplus foodstuffs to their livestock instead of buying in processed feed for livestock. These savings cannot be quantified as it would

vary from farm to farm. There would also be cost savings in relation to the production of hides and skins as livestock farmers would not need to pay a third party to process hides and skins. However, this figure will be difficult to quantify as it would depend on the different processes for treating hides and skins in different plants.

23. In addition there would be costs savings to farmers in either Bardsey or Caldey Islands as they will be permitted to bury their livestock on those islands. Previously, removal of the livestock would mean that farmers were required to charter a boat, with lifting equipment to take the carcasses to the mainland and have them disposed of at an approved disposal plant.

Business sectors affected

24. In the UK, the measures could have an impact on some pig farmers, 25,000 dairy farmers, plus 200 medium or large processors of milk, many hundreds of small processors of their own milk, producers of dairy products and the animal feed industry. Other producers of animal by-products such as 8,300 food manufacturing premises, and 35,000 retail outlets may be affected if they send surplus foodstuffs containing products of animal origin for feeding to livestock. There may also be an impact on the waste disposal industry if there is a need to secure alternative outlets for this material.

Issues of equity and fairness

25. Under section 106 of the Government of Wales Act 1998, a Community obligation of the United Kingdom to implement EU legislation is also an obligation of the Assembly. The Commission's Food and Veterinary Office has begun a programme of inspections to assess the application of the controls in all member States.

Consultation

With Stakeholders

- 26.A UK wide consultation on the proposed changes to the Animal By-Products Regulations 2003 was undertaken by the Department for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra) between 23 July 2004 and 15 October 2004. There was broad support for the changes. A list of consultees is attached at Annex A and the consultation documents can be found at:

- 27. As the effect of the changes are primarily deregulatory the Minister for Environment, Planning and Countryside agreed that there was no need for a separate consultation in Wales. However, Stakeholders were informed of the proposed changes to legislation by a letter of information, which was sent out on 14 November 2005. A list of the recipients is attached at Annex B.

With Subject Committee

28. These Regulations have been notified to the Environment, Planning and Countryside Committee, via the list of forthcoming legislation on 2 February 2005 (EPC(2)- 02-05 (p.3) Part 2, the item was not numbered) and has remained on the list ever since. However, the title of the legislation was stated

as the Animal By-Products (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2005. The Regulations were not identified for detailed scrutiny.

Consultation with small businesses: the Small Firms' Impact Test

29. Some of these affected by the measures are small businesses, primarily those farmers who feed their livestock on this material. The relevant industry organisations and some businesses in Wales have been consulted throughout negotiations on the EU measures.

Enforcement and sanctions, monitoring and review

- 30. Approvals under these Regulations are issued by the National Assembly for Wales. Inspections are carried out by the State Veterinary Service and enforcement is carried out by the Meat Hygiene Service in slaughterhouses and by local authorities elsewhere. These bodies already undertake this role.
- 31. The Welsh Assembly Government is keen to avoid the introduction of requirements for operators who process or feed milk or biscuit etc waste to be subject to approval or registration. Such a requirement would have significant resource implications for the Welsh Assembly Government as well as for those operations, which required approval or registration.

Sanctions under Animal By-Products (Wales) Regulations 2006 (which apply Regulation (EC) No 1774/2002)

- 32. Operators who do not comply may face prosecution. Prosecutions may result in a fine of up to £5000 and three months' imprisonment for cases heard in a magistrate's court or an unlimited fine and up to two years imprisonment for cases heard in the Crown Court. In addition, in the event of non-compliance, the Regulations provide for the suspension of an operator's approval, thus preventing the premises from receiving animal by-products.
- 33. Discussions on the measures continue at EU and national level on the controls on animal by-products.

Summary

34. These Regulations are being implemented because they seek to achieve a solution, which provides certainty about the controls that apply to the feeding of the relevant material and applies them in a proportionate manner.
