At Plenary on 23rd September, I promised to write to you to explain the detail of our target on access to general medical services and how it fits with the New Contract. On 15 October the Minister for Health and Social Services made a statement to Plenary as part of the debate on enhanced services and I know you took part in that debate.

The target is defined as "Patients will be able to access an appropriate member of the primary care team within 24 hours of requesting an appointment and much sooner in an emergency". This definition is also reflected in the new GMS contract. It is the new contract that provides the mechanism for delivering this policy. Access is one of the new enhanced services. The Directed Enhanced Service (DES) for access provides funding to enable practices to structure their work to deliver this commitment. The DES provides for patients to see a member of the primary care team who is competent to deal with the patient's clinical needs. Sometimes that will be a GP, but if appropriate, it could be a practice nurses, allied health professionals or other health care staff within the practice. Receptionists would not count for this purpose.

I hope this has clarified the position.
