## At/To Paul Davies:

I am writing in response to your recent Written Assembly Questions for the First Minister (WAQ58546-WAQ58549.) The First Minister has asked me to respond to you as I have responsibility for staffing matters within the Welsh Government. I shall answer each of your questions in turn:

WAQ58546-Would the First Minister state how much the Welsh Government has spent on recruitment agencies in each month since May 2011?

The Welsh Government uses recruitment agencies to identify, locate, assess and provide suitable candidates for both specialist roles, for which no existing staff are suitably qualified, and for the most senior roles in the organisation. The use of such agencies is in line with general practice across both the public and private sectors and is strictly controlled. Each recruitment exercise for the most senior roles has to be approved by the Welsh Government's Senior Civil Service Remuneration Committee, the membership of which includes three independent Non-Executive Directors, to ensure that the value for money is being achieved in the use of public funds. The table below details the cost of engaging these agencies between 1 May 2011 and 31 December 2011.

WAQ58547 -Would the First Minister state how much redundancy pay was paid to civil servants in the Welsh Government in each month since May 2011?

Individuals can use some or all of their severance pay to buy out an actuarial reduction in their pension and therefore we do not hold information on what individuals receive. However, we do know the total cost to the organisation of letting the individual leave.

Accounting procedures require that we accrue the cost of exits at the point the decision is made to exit staff, therefore it is our practice to report exit costs on this basis. Since April 2011 we have agreed that 296 staff can leave the organisation at an approximate cost of $£ 15.8$ million. This reduction in staffing levels will save the Welsh Government around $£ 13$ million each year in staff costs. Final audited costs will be published in the annual accounts.

WAQ58548 - Would the First Minister state how many people were working for the Welsh Government in (a) May 2010 and b) December 2011?

The table below details the number of staff in post at the end of each of the months in question, both headcount and Full-Time Equivalent.

WAQ58549 -Would the First Minister state how many temporary staff have been recruited by the Welsh Government since May 2011?

The Welsh Government employs a broad range of individuals on a temporary basis, from casual staff working on short-term projects, through to apprentices and student placements. The table below details the number of temporary staff recruited between 1 May 2011 and 31 December 2011, and also the number of temporary staff who left the organisation during the same period. The flexibility afforded by employing staff only when and where needed, and in some cases where there is a specialist knowledge requirement for a short-term period only, means that we will always have a requirement for temporary staff, regardless of how many permanent staff are employed.
