We do have two suggestions for improvement but we recognise that these might be matters of policy and practice rather then necessitating changes to the standing orders themselves. The first is that the schedule of committee meetings should be set out for a 12 month period. Clearly there will be later changes to this schedule however even a provisional schedule would be of great assistance in planning our engagement activities. Secondly it is at present difficult to keep track of all of the various Committee Inquiries perhaps on embarking on a review/inquiry or having issued a 'call for evidence' the expected timetable and progress of the inquiry could be published. This is certainly the case already for some committees but not all and on occasion the published information is not updated.
