Andrew R.T. Davies (South Wales Central): How much money has the Welsh Assembly Government given to each LEA for each year since 1999? (WAQ52258)

Jane Hutt: It is not possible to provide an exact figure for the amount of money given to each LEA. Information is available on how much LEAs spend on education but it is not possible to break that down between Welsh Assembly Government funding and other sources.

The majority of support from the Assembly Government is provided through the non-hypothecated local government settlement. Local authorities are free to determine how much of that settlement they spend on education along with the funding raised through council tax and sourced from reserves. In addition funding is provided through specific grants provided by the Welsh Assembly Government.
