The Deputy Minister for Agriculture, Food, Fisheries and European Programmes (Alun Davies): You will understand that applying for EU Protected Food Name status is a protracted process. At present, my department is supporting eight applications; Anglesey Sea Salt has been through National Consultation and is currently awaiting a Verification of Compliance before being submitted to the Commission. Pembrokeshire Potatoes has just gone out on National Consultation. Four applications are in late stages of draft and will go on National Consultation in the next few months and two are currently being amended with input from Defra. Efforts are currently concentrated on these eight applications but other products will of course be considered. Our plans for the future will be to raise the awareness of Protected Food Names within the industry.

**Edwina Hart:** Most of the regulation relating to businesses is UK or EU based. My department is currently liaising with Whitehall on the European Commission's plans to exempt micro-enterprises from future EU legislation unless there is an explicit justification to include them. I am also committed to reducing bureaucracy and regulation for business where this is under our control and regulatory impact assessments are undertaken on new Welsh Government legislation.

**Edwina Hart:** This is a matter for the planning authority that has responsibility for the area in which an Enterprise Zone is located. The Welsh Government has introduced secondary legislation to provide an

additional mechanism for simplifying planning via the use of Local Development Orders. Some authorities will choose to exercise those powers but they may not be appropriate in every Enterprise Zone. I am confident that all the planning authorities involved will make efficient use of their existing planning processes and arrangements as Enterprise Zone developments are considered.

The Minister for Education and Skills (Leighton Andrews): The non-statutory Skills Framework encompasses the skills of communication, number, ICT and thinking. The Skills Framework was developed and implemented as part of the wider work to review and introduce the revised national curriculum in 2008. Within that work, the cost of producing the Skills Framework document is approximately £40,000.

The new National Literacy and Numeracy Framework (LNF) builds on the non-statutory Skills Framework and addresses the issues identified by Estyn – it will have statutory force and identify clear annual expected outcomes in literacy and numeracy for all learners aged 5 to 14. It will replace the communication and number elements of the Skills Framework.

The ICT and Thinking elements of the Skills Framework will continue to be used by schools on a non-statutory basis.

The LNF will be issued for consultation in June and the consultation period will run to October. The LNF will be introduced on a statutory basis from September 2013.

**Leighton Andrews**: There is already a process in place through the School Council framework to allow secondary school pupils to discuss a range of issues including improvements to their learning, additions or changes to the timetable or improvements to the curriculum. I believe that this is sufficient to allow secondary school pupils opportunities to influence what they learn.

In accordance with the School Councils (Wales) Regulations 2005, governing bodies of maintained schools in Wales must establish a school council to enable the pupils to discuss matters relating to their school, their education and any other matters of concern or interest and to make representations about these matters to the headteacher and the governing body. The headteacher and governing body is also required to consider any matter communicated to them by the school council and to provide a response.

**Leighton Andrews:** I fully support the use of systems to track pupil developments both at primary and secondary school level. Tracking systems play a role as part of the tool kit used by teachers, schools and local authorities to monitor progress and identify pupils.

The School Standards Unit meets termly with local authorities at consortium level to review their progress in developing systematic target-setting and providing support for under-performing schools. Part of this work involves working with consortia to ensure that effective pupil-tracking systems are in place to develop effective teaching and ensure that pupils at all levels receive the right support in order to achieve their full potential.

In the recent regional conferences held across Wales in March "Teaching Makes a Difference: One Year On" sessions were focussed on pupil tracking systems across Wales to help share best practice.
