The Minister for Education and Skills (Leighton Andrews): The Learning in Digital Wales (LiDWG) Grant Programme comprises of the four following key strands of activity:

- (a) Capital funding to upgrade the core network for local authorities in Wales (PSBA and Janet links to support enhanced 1Gbps connections to the Internet for educational purposes for each local authority area).
- (b) Capital funding to upgrade the PSBA (Public Sector Broadband Aggregation) connection at each school maintained by local authorities including foundation schools and all schools in the Voluntary Aided sector so as to ensure a minimum of 100Mbps for each secondary school and 10Mbps for each primary and special school and pupil referral unit by July 2014.
- (c) PSBA revenue funding for two years to cover the revenue costs of improved broadband services during 2013-15.
- (d) Additional capital funding to all schools to facilitate ICT infrastructure improvements at local level. This funding is being paid as grants to local authorities based on an allocation of £10,000 per primary and special school and pupil referral unit and £20,000 per secondary school.

The Welsh Government is directly funding (a) and (b) through the Public Sector Broadband Aggregation Project. Broadband installations to schools will be managed by our PSBA provider, Logicalis. The revenue costs in (c) will follow the broadband installations to schools and there is no set allocation per school or authority for this expenditure. It is our working assumption that local authorities will submit claims for reimbursement to the Welsh Government on receipt of invoices from Logicalis.

Local authorities have been required to draw up spending plans for the capital grant funding in (d) in consultation with their schools. The grant may be used for the following purposes:

Priority 1: To ensure all schools have robust network infrastructure including Wi-Fi coverage. Eligible expenditure includes such technology which delivers Ethernet and/or wireless connectivity to end devices or to network devices within the school's cartilage, and meets defined minimum technical standards.

Priority 2: To allow schools to add value to robust network infrastructure including (where appropriately managed) technology to support innovative approaches and Bring Your Own Device schemes. Eligible expenditure includes any device compatible with the technical standards defined for Priority 1.

Leighton Andrews: Ofqual is the regulator for England. Welsh Government was represented at the Exam Stakeholder Engagement Group meeting on 21 March 2013. We have not pulled out of stakeholder groups organised by Ofqual. However, we will review this position in the light of the Secretary of State for Education's letter of 20 May to me and the Education Minister in Northern Ireland in which he signalled his view that the three country regulation of GCSEs and A levels is no longer an achievable objective.

Carl Sargeant: Our immediate priority is to collate information that has already been collected by local authorities and housing associations on the extent of under occupation by local authority area. This will inform the "Smaller Properties" Programme.
