Dear Janet Finch-Saunders MS,

Thank you for your tabled written question of 1 October regarding the steps Natural Resources Wales (NRW) have taken to improve the capability of the flood warning systems.

The storms throughout 2020, and in particular those in February, made it the worst year of flooding in decades, with over 2,600 homes and 600 businesses affected during Storms Dennis and Ciara. Responding to these events through a pandemic was extremely challenging for all involved. However, it is important that lessons are learnt to help improve response procedures.

NRW undertook a thorough review of its activities relating to the February 2020 floods, publishing its findings in October 2020. It identified improvements in the short, medium and long term, which are being implemented. NRW has already made changes to some of their processes, for example:

- less emphasis on providing updates for warnings already issued and clear prioritisation on new warnings;
- further steps taken to improve system reliance to their website;
- improvement to on-line services, with better data on rainfall, river levels and sea;
- increased the numbers of staff on incident response rotas.
