Request for Information.

I refer to your request received on 10 June in which you asked,

Could you please send me a list of all Assembly Members who have outstanding bills to Charlton House Catering in the National Assembly? Could you please provide the name of AM, amount owed and date of last paid bill in your response?

I understand that some public money is used as a subsidy for the food provided to Assembly Members. I therefore consider this as a matter of public interest.

In response I am able to advise you that the National Assembly for Wales does not hold this information.

Catering services at the National Assembly are provided by an external contractor. The current contract was awarded to Charlton House Catering and commenced on 1 September 2006.

Any credit arrangements between individual Assembly Members and Charlton House Catering are negotiated by those parties and the National Assembly has no part in, or knowledge of, such individual agreements.

I understand that information has recently been published providing data on outstanding payments due from Members of Parliament. However there is a different arrangement in the House of Commons where catering staff are employed directly by the Parliament.
