Further to WAQ60463 regarding actions taken to ensure patients are treated when hospitals miss Welsh Government targets, I am now able to give a response.

When a Health Board misses any Welsh Government target, not just waiting times, they are subject to action as set out in the Delivery Framework. The Delivery Framework defines an escalation process which reinforces the accountability of Health Boards and Trusts for delivery. This can range from additional reporting requirements to reporting to the Chief Executive, NHS Wales.

Which hospitals in Wales have an Eye Clinic Liaison Officer and which do not?

Following my interim response to the recent written question outlined above, I can confirm there are currently ten Eye Clinic Liaison Officers funded by two third sector organisations, RNIB and Sight Support, to work in the following hospitals:

UHW Cardiff  
Singleton Swansea  
Ysbyty Cwm Rhondda  
Hywel Dda  
Ysbyty Gwynedd Bangor  
Princess of Wales Bridgend and Neath Port Talbot  
Royal Glamorgan and Prince Charles Merthyr

There are also two part-time ECLO's working in Abergele and funded by Betsi Cadwaladr health board.

This information has been provided to my officials by RNIB and Sight Support. Whilst we have not previously held information centrally on this, as part of our work on the Eye Health Care Plan we will be ensuring we have detailed information on resources available to deliver our key priorities.
