The apparent increase in costs is due primarily to the consolidation of teams and budgets for research from across WAG into a single area in the Central Services & Administration MEG. Plans for research to be conducted in future years are under development and budgets are not yet determined.

The **Department for the Economy and Transport** (DE&T) does not often commission scientific research for its own purposes. It does not provide funding for some R&D within businesses and also for successful applications for Collaborative Industrial Research Projects (CIRPs) between businesses and higher education institutions, but does not commission this. Total funding for CIRPs 2006-11 is £3,953,956, made up of Welsh Assembly Government and EU WEFO-based funding.

DE&T is still assembling the necessary information to present an accurate/complete picture. The table below shows information accessed thus far and the Minister for the Economy and Transport will write to you shortly with further details.

Expenditure in the three yearly tables is rounded to the nearest thousand pounds. It expresses estimated expenditure in each year, not total contract costs. The table relates to externally commissioned research work paid for through the research budget. It excludes grant-aided research. Past figures include research funded from programme budgets as well as the DCELLS research budget. Predicted figures exclude research from programme budgets as this is impossible to predict with any accuracy.

DCELL budget for the following three years is planned to be £2,007,000 for 2010-11, £2,460,000, £2,370,000 and £2,280,000 for social scientific research, and nil for natural/physical scientific research.

The scientific research budget for many of the policy areas covered by the **Department for Environment and Sustainability** (DES_ is held on an England and Wales basis and managed by the UK Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) and the UK Department of Energy and Climate Change (DECC). Examples of research programmes influenced include climate change mitigation and adaptation, waste, air quality.
