I am writing to respond to some of the points you raised at the debate on the Public Services Ombudsman for Wales's Annual report 2006/07, held on 12th December.

You asked whether the Ombudsman would continue to have a role in NHS complaints once the arrangements provided for in the NHS Redress Measure are put in place. As you know, we are looking to develop a holistic approach to the handling of complaints in the NHS, part of which is to empower NHS organisations to settle locally certain issues where there may have been negligence, and without making people take the legal route.

The Ombudsman provides a valuable service when people are unhappy with the way in which the NHS deals with their concerns. This will continue under any new arrangements for NHS complaints and redress. My officials are currently considering the potential impact this may have on the number of Ombudsman's investigations and how this should be provided for.

I am copying this letter to Andrew Davies, Minister for Finance and Public Service Delivery, who led the debate.
