Mae'r Cynulliad yn cydnabod bod y cynlluniau i gael dim ond un Canolfan Reoli ar gyfer y Gwasanaeth Tân yng Nghymru gyfan wedi eu llunio'n wael ac y gallent beryglu bywydau. Credwn fod y cynnig i greu un Canolfan Reoli yn gwbl annerbyniol, gan y byddai'n arwain at oedi wrth ddelio â galwadau ac anfon peiriannau tân ac yn golygu gwasanaeth llai effeithiol ar gyfer y cyhoedd yng Nghymru. Galwn ar yr Ysgrifennydd Cartref i wrthod y cynnig hwn ac i ymgynghori â'r Cynulliad ynghylch unrhyw gynigion eraill sy'n effeithio ar y Gwasanaeth Tân yng Nghymru.

This Assembly recognises that plans for a single Fire Service Control Centre covering the whole of Wales are ill-conceived and could place lives at risk. We believe that the proposal for a single Control Centre is totally unacceptable, will lead to delays in call handling and despatch of fire appliances and result in a reduced service for the public in Wales. We call on the Home Secretary to reject this proposal and to consult with the Assembly on any further proposals affecting the Fire Service in Wales.

Mae'r Cynulliad Cenedlaethol yn nodi â phryder weithred y Christian Institute yn yr Alban wrth lwyddo i ohirio cyllid y Cyngor ar gyfer PHACE West - darparwr gwasanaethau HIV mwyaf yr Alban - trwy honni bod yr elusen yn mynd yn groes i adran 28 y Ddeddf Llywodraeth Leol.

Mae'r Cynulliad Cenedlaethol yn credu bod hyn yn dangos rhagfarn ar raddfa fawr ac mae'n pryderu am y niwed a achosir i wasanaethau HIV yn yr Alban.

Mae'r Cynulliad Cenedlaethol yn ymrwymo i barhau i ymladd i ddiddymu Adran 28 ac i barhau i gefnogi gwaith gwerthfawr elusennau HIV Cymru.

The National Assembly notes with concern, the action of the Christian Institute in Scotland in managing to suspend Council funding for PHACE West - Scotland's largest HIV service provider by claiming that the charity was in breach of Section 28 of the Local Government Act.

The National Assembly believes that this is bigotry and prejudice on a large scale and is concerned at the damage caused to HIV services in Scotland.

The National Assembly pledges to continue the fight to scrap Section 28 and to continuing to support the valuable work of HIV charities in Wales.

Mae'r Cynulliad yn cydnabod fod astudiaethau diweddar wedi dangos fod rhagnodi Beta Interferon i bobl sy'n dioddef o Sglerosis Ymledol Cynyddol Eilaidd yn gallu arwain at fanteision clinigol ac iechyd sylweddol. Yn dilyn argymhellion y Sefydliad Cenedlaethol ar gyfer Rhagoriaeth Glinigol (NICE) yn ddiweddarach eleni, dylai'r Cynulliad ystyried yn ofalus effaith bositif Beta Interferon wrth arafu'r ffordd y mae Sglerosis Ymledol Cynyddol Eilaidd yn datblygu. Yr ydym yn croesawu penderfyniad y llywodraeth i ofyn i NICE wneud adroddiad ar y mater hwn, a rhaid i'r Cynulliad archwilio'r canfyddiadau hyn yn ofalus i sicrhau fod pobl sy'n dioddef o Sglerosis Ymledol yn mwynhau ansawdd bywyd mor uchel â phosibl.

The Assembly recognises that recent studies have shown that the prescribing of Beta Interferon for sufferers of Secondary Progressive Multiple Sclerosis can result in substantial clinical and health benefits. Following the recommendations of NICE later this year, the Assembly should consider carefully the positive effect that Beta Interferon can have in slowing the rate at which Secondary Progressive MS develops. The decision of the government to ask NICE to report on this issue is welcome, and the Assembly must examine these findings carefully to ensure that MS sufferers enjoy as high a quality of life as possible.

Mae'r Cynulliad yn croesawu'r targedau penodol yn y Mesur Targedau Bwyd a Ffermio Organig y dylai o leiaf 30% o dir ffermio'r Deyrnas Unedig ac o leiaf 20% o'r bwyd a fwyteir yn y Deyrnas Unedig fod yn organig erbyn y flwyddyn 2010, a chred y dylid pennu targedau tebyg ar gyfer amaethyddiaeth yng Nghymru.

Mae'r Cynulliad yn nodi hefyd a gofid bod 70% o'r bwyd organig a fwyteir yn y Deyrnas Unedig yn cael ei fewnforio a chred y dylid pennu targedau penodol ar gyfer hybu bwyd organig yng Nghymru ymhlith defnyddwyr yng Nghymru a rhannau eraill o'r Deyrnas Unedig.

This Assembly welcomes the specific targets set out in the Organic Food and Farming Targets Bill that by the year 2010 at least 30% of UK farmland and at least 20% of the food consumed in the UK should be organic, and believes that similar targets should be set for agriculture in Wales.

This Assembly also notes with concern that 70% of organic food consumed in the UK is imported, and believes that specific targets should be set for the promotion of organic food from Wales amongst consumers in Wales and other parts of the UK.
